How will this course be delivered?	You will be working with your tutor and other students online on Microsoft Teams. This will involve a regular video meeting every week, using the Microsoft Teams app, with supporting learning resources in the virtual classroom. We will supply you with a login and password when you enrol, and we can provide telephone support to help you to get into the virtual classroom on your computer.
How will I know I'm making progress?	Your tutor will set objectives for each session and give feedback on how you are progressing. You will agree personal targets as part of your Individual Learning Plan (ILP), and you will review your targets throughout the course to check your own progress.
Will I need to study or practise outside the classroom?	Learners will be required to complete two written mandatory units to achieve this qualification.
What will I need to take to the course?	<p>You will need either a computer with Microsoft Teams or a Smart device (phone/tablet) with the Microsoft Teams application and access to the Internet.</p> <p>Please bring a pen and notepad to each session.</p>

- * Level 3 Certificate in Preparing to Work in Early Years Education and Care.
