How will the course be delivered?

- Weeks 5-8: Exploring sensory processing, perception, and cognition in relation to ASD.
- Weeks 9-12: Understanding communication differences and developing positive communication strategies.
- Weeks 13-16: Analysing social interaction and relationships in the context of ASD.
- Weeks 17-20: Supporting positive behaviour, mental health, and wellbeing for autistic individuals.

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How will the course be delivered?

This is an **E-Learning course** and is exclusively delivered via an online learning, self-study programme. You will be enrolled for an online learning platform and will work independently through the units and materials provided.

Will I need to practise outside the classroom?

This is an E-learning course, and your study pattern is self-managed. A commitment of 2 - 3 hours per week is suggested to enable successful completion of the course within the timescale of 20 weeks.

How will I know I'm making progress?

E-learning- You will receive regular feedback from an assessor following completion and submission of individual units.

What will I need?

E-learning- A laptop or desktop computer with internet access is required for completion of coursework and home learning
