This must include 45 credits from the Creative Industries or Related Studies subject groups at Level 3.</p> <p>15 credits from any combination of the Study Skills or Introductory Academic subject groups. Academic Study Techniques is mandatory within the Study Skills group.</p> <p>Units studied will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Colour Theory and Application</li><li>Representation Theory</li><li>Photography Skills</li><li>Working to a Media Client Brief</li><li>Transitions from Written Text to Screen</li><li>Practical Interview Techniques</li><li>Pre-production Planning Techniques for the Creative Media Industries</li><li>Ownership and Control in the Media</li><li>Imagery for the Creative and Digital Industry</li></ul>
